**Distinguishing Characteristics:**

Prostomium long, triangular, 3X longer than wide.

Acicular spines begin on setiger 1 IN TYPE (L. HARRIS, PERS. COMM.)

These curved acicular setae nearly completely replace the  
capillaries immediately but occur only one to a fascicle. The posterior segments  
are much longer than wide and the arrangement of the acicular setae give the post-  
erior a quadrate cross section.

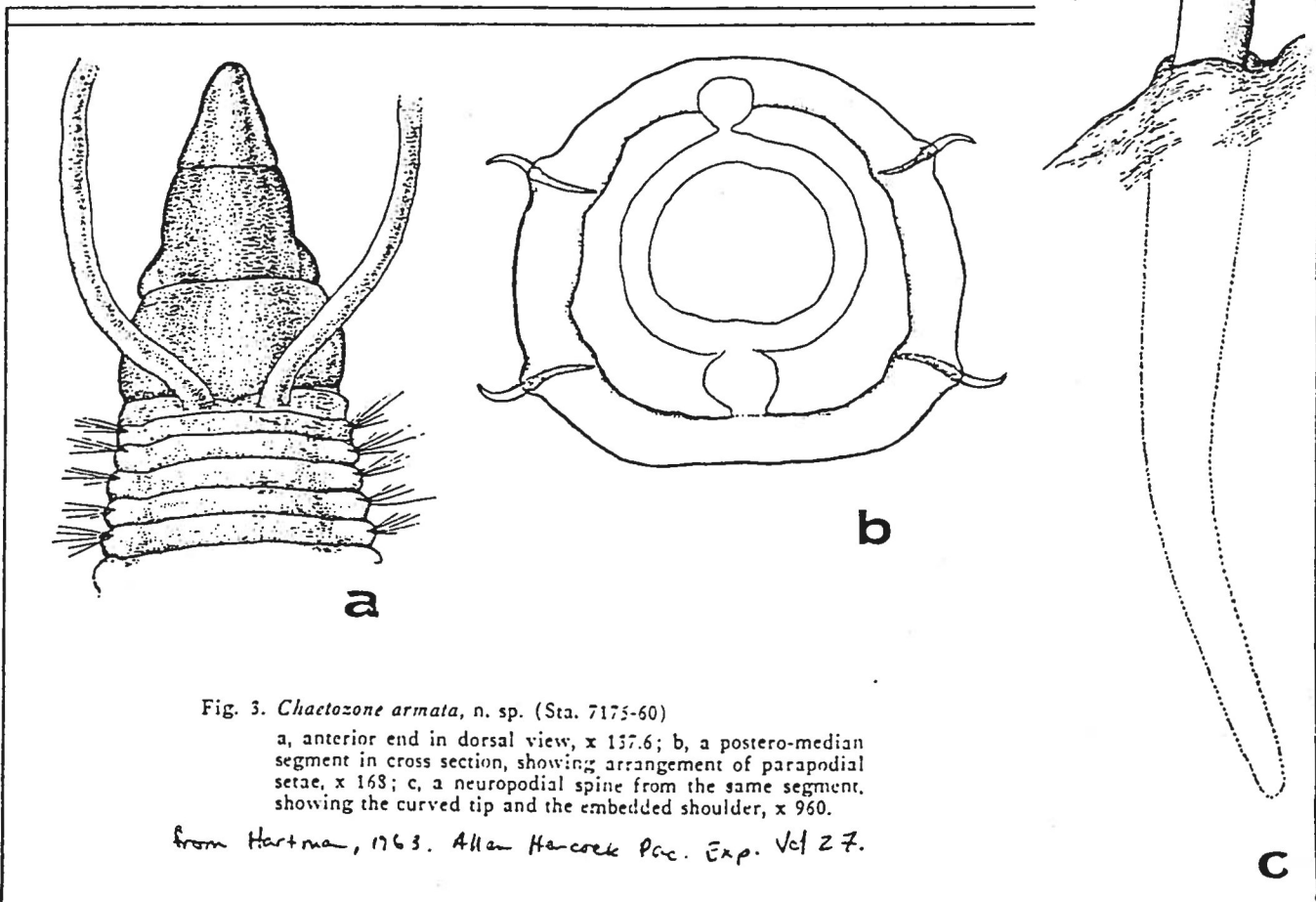


Fig. 3. *Chaetozone armata*, n. sp. (Sta. 7175-60)
