

Shell ovate to globular, rather thin to transluscent. Sculpture absent or of fine commarginal striae. Periostracum yellowish, thin and adherent. Umbones prominent. Hinge plate feeble, with a cardinal and posterior lateral tooth in the right valve, and two cardinal teeth and a posterior lateral tooth in the left valve. Lenght to 25 mm.
