Diagnostic characters:

1. 15 to 16 pairs of elytra? (there are no complete specimens).

2. Lateral antennae inserted ventrally (ceratophores not fused to the distal tips of the prostomial lobes) (Fig. 1).

3. Prostomial lobes and medial ceratophore pigmented (Fig. 1).

4. Both pairs of eyes located in the posterior region of the prostomium (Fig 1).

8. Notosetae coarsely spinose, spines present to the distal tip, widely cleft tip

5. Neurosetae with semilunar pockets located proximally to the transverse spines (Fig. 3).

6. Neurosetae bifid, lacking transverse spines near the distal tip (Fig. 3).

7. Neurosetal shafts subequal in thickness to notosetal shafts.

Eyes are not present in Subadyte mexicana.
