## Distinguishing Characteristics:

Body elongate, three times longer than wide 2 mm: 6 mm. Cephalon with an elongate, pointed rostrum; antero-lateral borders each with a wide angulate projection. Eyes dorsal and situated inboard of the post-lateral borders. Second and third segment of thorax separate from one another. Abdomen consisting of one segment, angulate with medially recurved posterolateral projections and a medially unilobate posterior margin that does not exceed posteriorly beyond the limits of the posterolateral angles. Important difference between *J. solasteri* and *J. occidentalis* is the margin of cephalon. (See Figures)
