## Diagnostic Characters:

- 1. Body very thin and elongate; extremely hard to tell which end is anterior or posterior.
- 2. Thin irirdescent cuticle overlaying pinkish body core.
- 3. Mesenterial insertions visible but uncountable.
- 4. Tentacles are so far invisible to my eye, which explains provisional family name.
- 5. Oral region tinged with dark purplish.
- 6. A most distinctive anemone.

Distribution: OCSD 8724 34/I; Conl/1; 8606 4/3; Also MMS/Battelle Camp; Kinnetics/Encina; Pt Loma. 34 to about 100 meters in

depth.

Comments: Common name is "thread anemone" of Ljubenkov.
